It's a non working replica of a 1915 HD v-Twin board track racer.

Built on an old bicycle frame with added found objects, plywood fuel tank, PVC pipe exhaust, old water timer with sink drain filter, wood turned cylinders and heads, old spark plugs donated by Jack Zylmans, and various old plumbing items found in Rob's garage.

The original HD- V Twin when racing had no gears and no breakers and were "ouch started" with the rider jumping on laying flat with foot pegs at the back axle, using the accelerator to control speed which was up to 68 mph on the timber-board track around football fields around America.

On Friday August 12, 22 members enjoyed a BBQ and a very enlightening talk by Gary Flanagan who was visiting family from Western Australia.

Gary presented to the group his career highlights working as a highly skilled and informed welder. Gary has worked all around the world, welding on many major projects both under water and above ground.

Gary surprised most of those attending by informing the group that welding under water was both easier to do, and also achieving a better-looking weld than welding in a

conventional environment.

Gary has worked on huge infrastructure projects from offshore drilling platforms on the Australian North West Shelf, submarines in Scotland, and pipelines in Norway. He has spent a lifetime in the industry, and his informative talk showed his knowledge and ability.

Many questions were asked on the topic, and it was interesting to hear that a couple of those attending had been quiet in offering their knowledge on the topic before the day. In particular Phil Price surprised all of those attending, with not only his interest in the topics discussed, but also it was learned by the group that he had previously been deeply involved in the welding profession. We all thought he was only into woodwork.

Hopefully Gary's inspirational talk will be followed in the future by others, who can contribute both knowledge and interest in topics, to assist many of the shed members to increase and diversify their interest in different topics.


